





AICE Requirements

#### What is A.I.C.E?

- Advanced International Certificate of Education
- A <u>rigorous</u> international pre-university curriculum and examination system which emphasizes the value of <u>broad</u> and <u>balanced study</u> for academically advanced students
- A <u>rigorous</u> curriculum that is heavily <u>writing-based</u> with a strong emphasis on <u>critical thinking</u>, <u>analysis</u>, and <u>interpretation</u>

# Why Cambridge?

- ✓ Flexible curriculum Student chooses based on interest
- ✓ Future predictor of college success Rigor, Critical thinking
- ✓ GPA points Pre-AICE classes are weighted the same as Honors classes and AICE classes are weighted the same as AP and IB
- ✓ Earn college credit
- ✓ Bright Futures If the student earns the AICE diploma <u>AND</u> put in 100 hours of community service, you are guaranteed the top level of Bright Futures award, no matter what your SAT or ACT scores are (the minimum score is waived)

## What are the AICE Diploma Requirements?

- Pass seven (7) A/AS Level Exams
- Take a minimum of 1 exam in each category
- Complete within 25 months of the first exam
- Complete 100 hours community service

# What is the difference between a Cambridge AICE completer, AICE candidate, & AICE recipient?

- ✓ <u>Cambridge AICE curriculum completer</u> The student sat for all seven required classes but did not pass the necessary exams for the diploma. The student successfully completed all the high school requirements for graduation, but must meet the SAT/ACT scores to qualify for Florida Academic Bright Futures Scholarship (FAS)
- ✓ <u>Cambridge AICE candidate</u> Student is awaiting results of the exams and the diploma at the time of graduation
- ✓ <u>Cambridge AICE recipient</u> Student earned the AICE diploma prior to their senior year

# What are the expectations of a student in the AICE Program?

#### Do

- Expect to struggle! (If you're not challenged, you're not growing!!)
- ASK FOR HELP
- 3. Keep up with your work Stay Organized
- Ask teachers for help/Attend Office Hours/Study Groups/Tutoring
- 5. Try different solutions/study methods
- Self-advocate

#### Don't

- Dismiss a low grade learn from your mistakes
- 2. Focus on the exam results/grade only
- 3. Engage in harmful attitudes or blaming others
- 4. Blame the "teaching style"
- 5. Give Up! Have GRIT!!

# How and when are the AICE exams given?

- ❖ April/June Some exams may occur after school ends
- ❖ The June exam timetable comes out in November Please plan vacations around tests
- ❖ Test dates are NOT flexible They are set by Cambridge University
- \* THERE ARE NO MAKE UP DAYS!
- ❖ Each exam has at least 2 papers and the student **MUST** sit for <u>ALL</u> parts to receive credit
- ❖ The student **MUST** sit for <u>ALL</u> parts of the exam, or he/she will receive an obligation
- \*Retakes are available in October upon request of the student
- ❖ There is a 25-month timeframe for the AICE diploma track

## Do all colleges accept AICE credit?

- ❖ More than 500 colleges and universities nationwide accept AICE credits
- Each exam passed = college credit earned
- ❖ All Florida colleges accept/award college credit for passing scores on AICE exams
- ❖ Private and out-of-state colleges will have their own policy about credit-by-exam CHECK!




Community Service

# How do you start your Community Service hours?

- Go to <u>www.nsbhigh.com</u> → Parents and students → Click on School Counseling Dept→ Click on Community Service
- 2. View the power point presentation training guide and complete the post-test (The power point provides general guidelines on volunteering, tips to find a volunteer placement, and the necessary paperwork to document service hours)
- 3. Turn the post test into Mrs. Ursini in the school counseling office
- 4. Complete the Youth Partnership Program Agreement (This form should be completed by the student, parent/guardian, and agency PRIOR to the volunteer service)
- 5. Turn the completed agreement form into Mrs. Ursini for approval BEFORE completing community service hours
- 6. Complete the Youth Partnership Program sign in sheet (This form is used by the student to document their volunteer service and signed by the volunteer site designee)



### **Assessments**

 9<sup>th</sup> Grade students must take the Reading Progress Monitoring Exam (PM 3 FAST)

 10<sup>th</sup> Grade students must pass the Reading Progress Monitoring Exam (PM 3 FAST)

#### End of Course Exams

1. Algebra 1 (Pass the TEST + 30% of final course grade)

Students will take either the Alg. 1 EOC or the BEST Alg. 1 Test (the test the student takes depends on when they completed the class.)

- 2. Geometry (30% of final course grade)
- 3. Biology (30% of final course grade)
- 4. <u>U.S. History</u> (30% of final course grade)

## Scholar Designation

#### In addition to finishing the Cambridge AICE curriculum, you must:

- Pass the ELA Grade 10 statewide assessment
- 2. Earn 1 credit in Algebra 2
- 3. Pass the Geometry EOC
- 4. Earn 1 credit in Statistics or an equally rigorous mathematics course;
- 5. Pass the Biology I EOC Or the AICE Biology exam.
- 6. Earn 1 credit in Chemistry or Physics
- 7. Earn 1 credit in a course equally rigorous to Chemistry or Physics
- 8. Pass the U.S. History EOC
- 9. Earn 2 credits in the same World Language
- 10. Earn at least 1 credit in AP, AICE or a dual enrollment course (Must pass the corresponding AP, AICE, or dual enrollment exam)

## Walking in White

Each year, a group of graduating seniors earn the honor of graduating with a white cap and gown — "Walking In White" is unique to NSBHS.

#### Below are the requirements for the Class of 2024:

- 3.5 weighted GPA
- 2. 10 honors, AP, AICE, and/or Dual Enrollment courses
- 3. A minimum of 1100 on the math and verbal sections of the SAT or a minimum of a 'composite' score of 23 on the ACT
- 4. 75 hours of pre-approved community service

## Dual Enrollment Eligibility

#### To dual enroll at Daytona State, you must meet the following requirements:

- Earned high school credit
- 2. 3.0 minimum unweighted GPA
- 3. Required PERT Scores Reading (106) Writing (103) Math (114 or 123) or SAT, ACT or PSAT Scores

#### To continue dual enrollment classes, you must:

- 1. Maintain a 3.0 or higher unweighted GPA
- 2. Maintain a 2.0 or higher cumulative college GPA
- 3. Earn a "C" or better in all courses

Dual enrolled students are eligible to take 2 online classes total during each semester at DSC



**December 1st, 2023-** Deadline for Spring registration


